Directions: Do a rough draft of your book report at home. Skip lines! Edit your own work. Then ask someone else to edit it, too. Once your rough draft has been edited take the booklet we made together in class and write your report. There can be no spelling errors or incomplete sentences. **DO YOUR BEST WORK!** Follow the directions below for each part of your report. For the booklet, **DO NOT SKIP LINES!**

Page 1 (cover page): Use creative lettering to write the book title and the author's name. Draw a picture that represents the book in some way. Be artistic and neat. Use color (colored pencils are better than markers for this project). Be sure and write your name neatly on the cover.

Page 2: Describe where and when the story takes place. Be creative and catch the reader's attention!

Page 3: Identify the main character. Describe in two to three lines, giving many details. If possible, give the character's name, age, physical description and personality traits. What kind of person is the main character?

Page 4: Describe the main problem (the plot) in the story. Go for the big picture on this one, avoid details! Don't try to tell the main story! In three to four sentences say what the story is mainly about.

Page 5: Summarize how the story ends. What happens to the character? Is the problem solved? What happened?

Page 6: Share your opinion about the book. Did you like it or not? Make sure you tell why. Justify your opinions with reasons.

1. Follow the format of the book report, carefully! 10 pts.
2. Use complete sentences, which also means no run-ons! 10 pts
3. Everything is spelled correctly. Double check with a dictionary. If you are the least bit suspicious about a word...check it out! 10 pts
